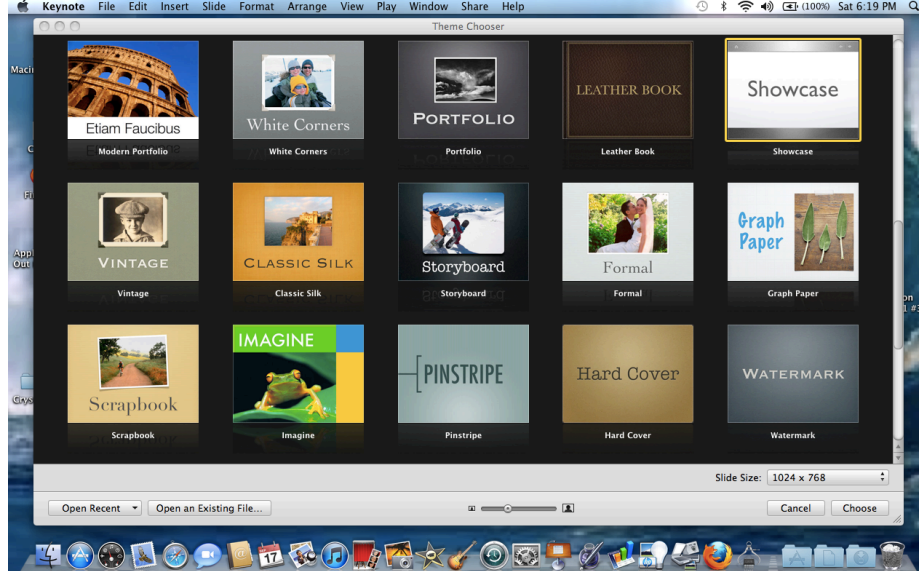


Steps to make a Keynote with Long Vowel Sounds

1. Double-Click on the Keynote podium at the bottom of your MacBook screen.



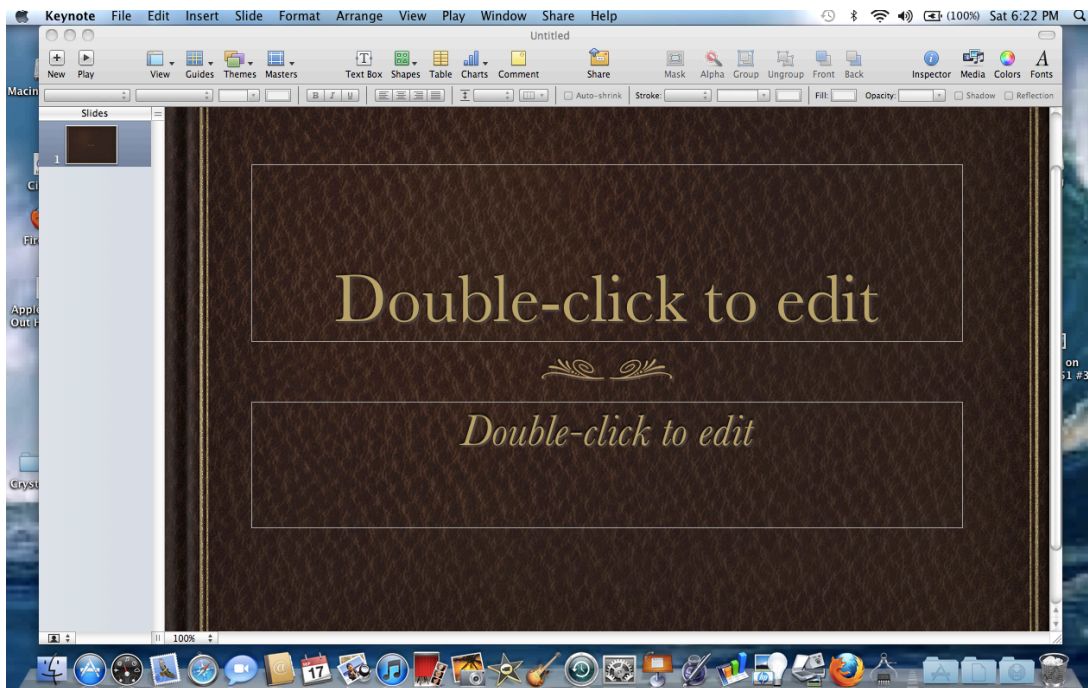
2. This will bring up the "Theme Chooser" within Keynote.



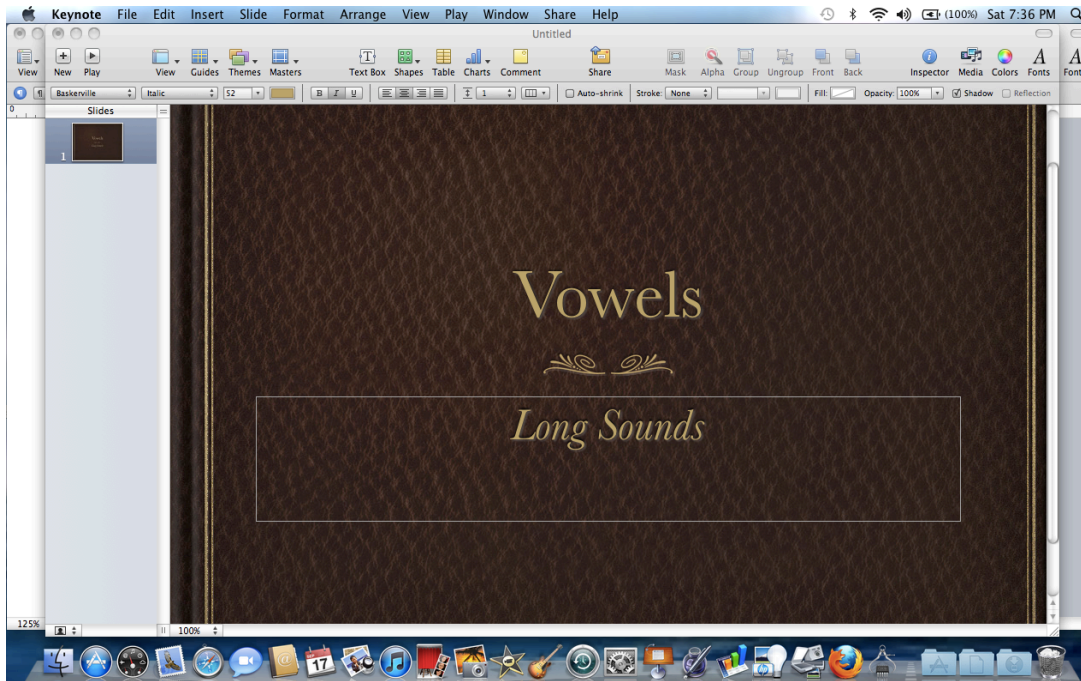
1. For this example, you will double-click on the "Leather Book" template.



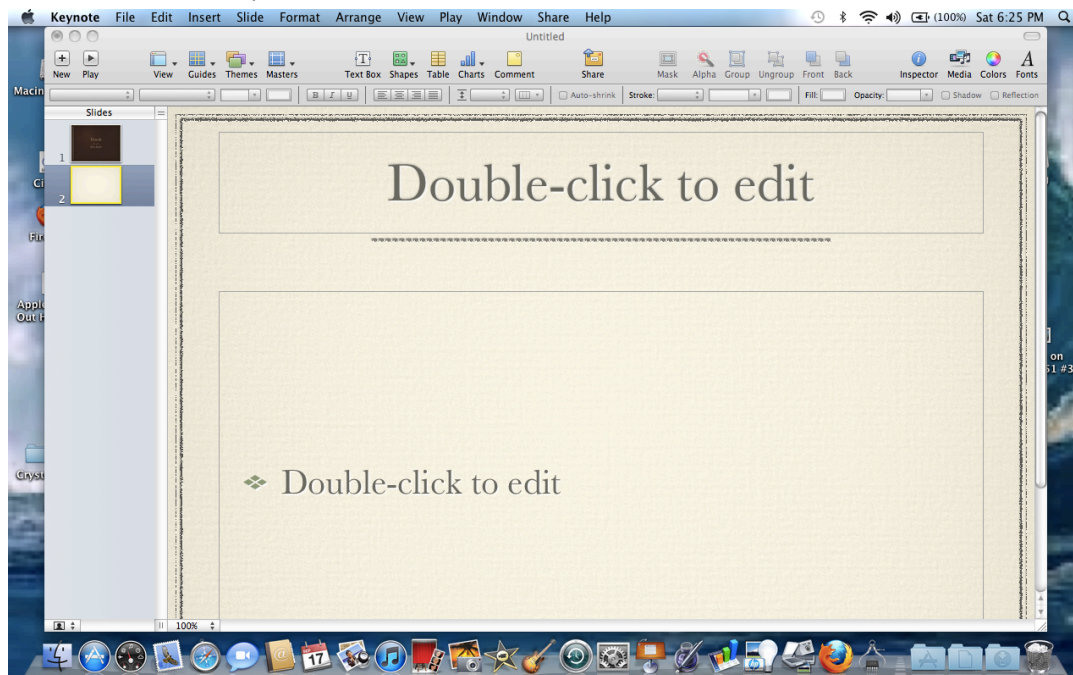
4. The following screen will appear after double-clicking on the "Leather Book" template.



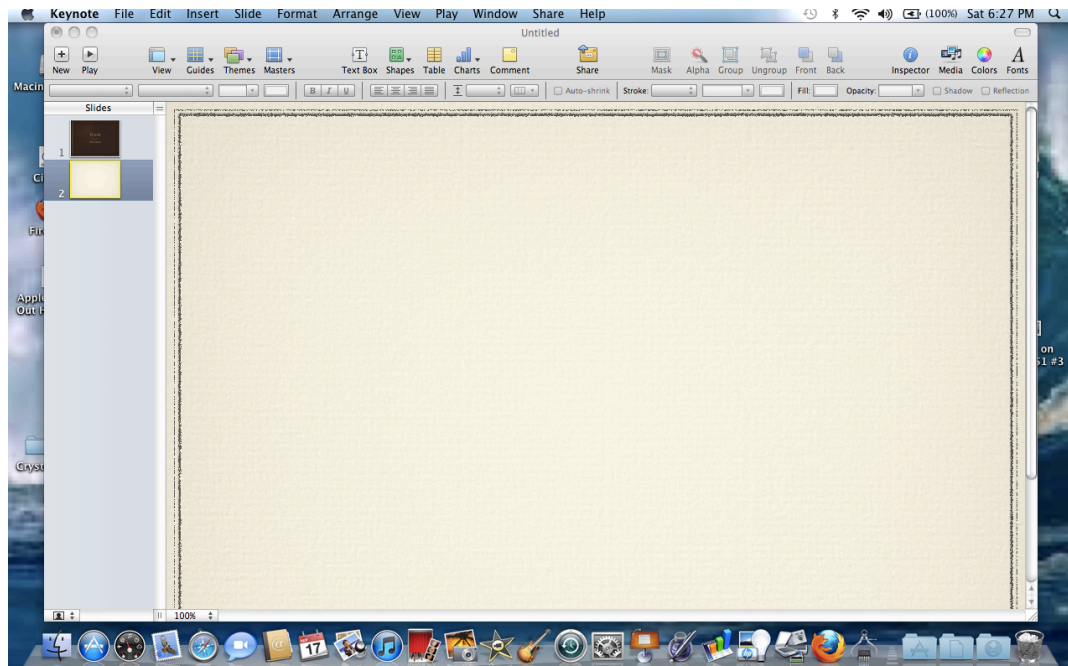
5. Double-click on the top title, and change it to "Vowels." Double-click on the bottom title, and change it to "Long Sounds."



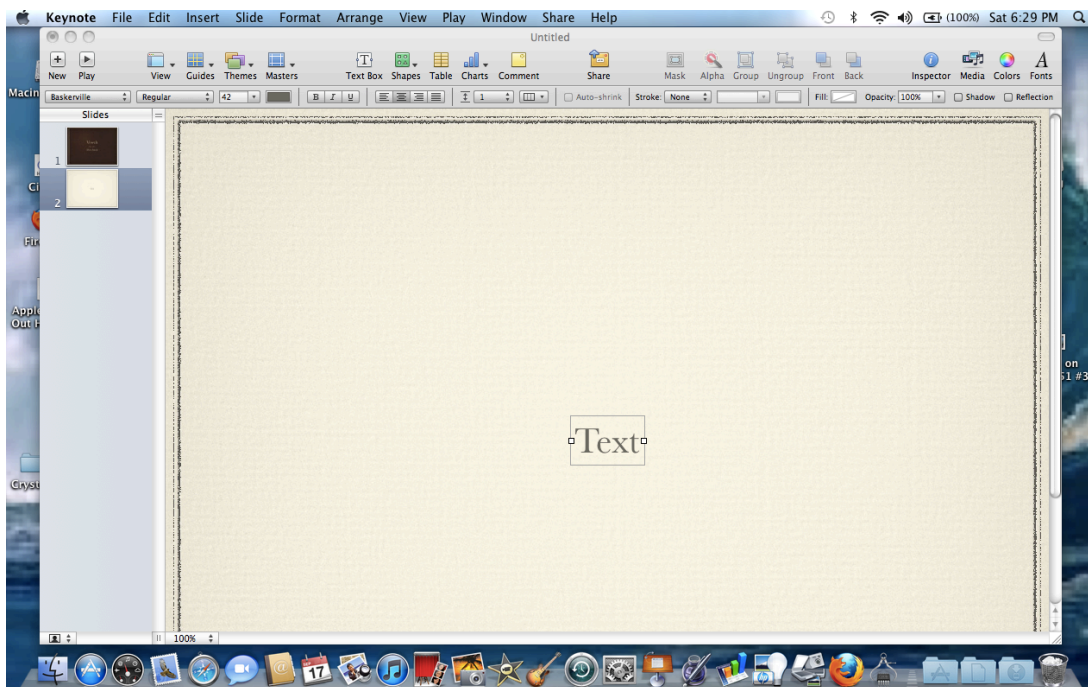
6. Click on the + sign at the top left of the screen to add a new slide. The screen below will appear. Click on the drop down menu next to "Masters" to pick the format of your next slide. For this example, you will select "Blank."



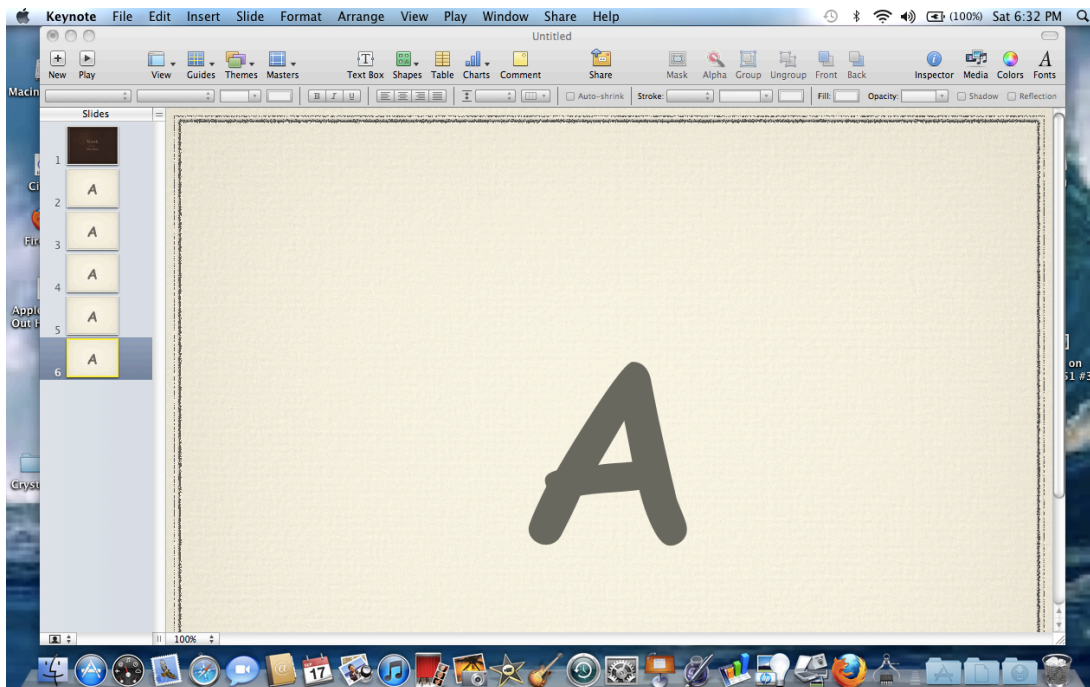
7. The following "Blank" slide will appear.



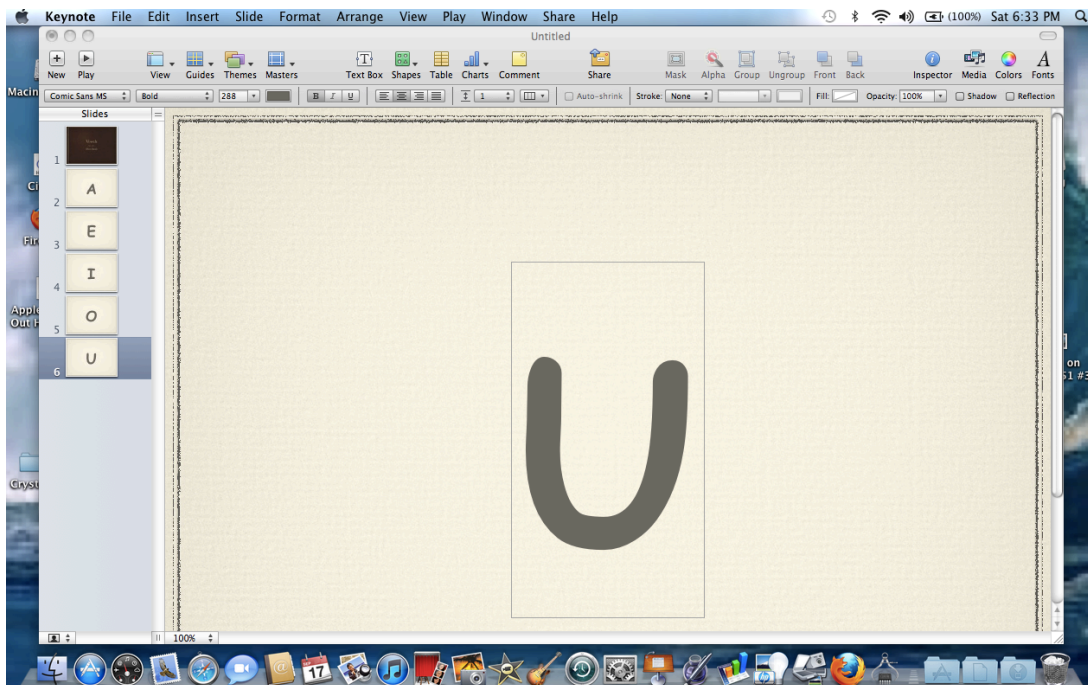
8. Click on "Text Box" to add text to the slide. The following screen will appear.



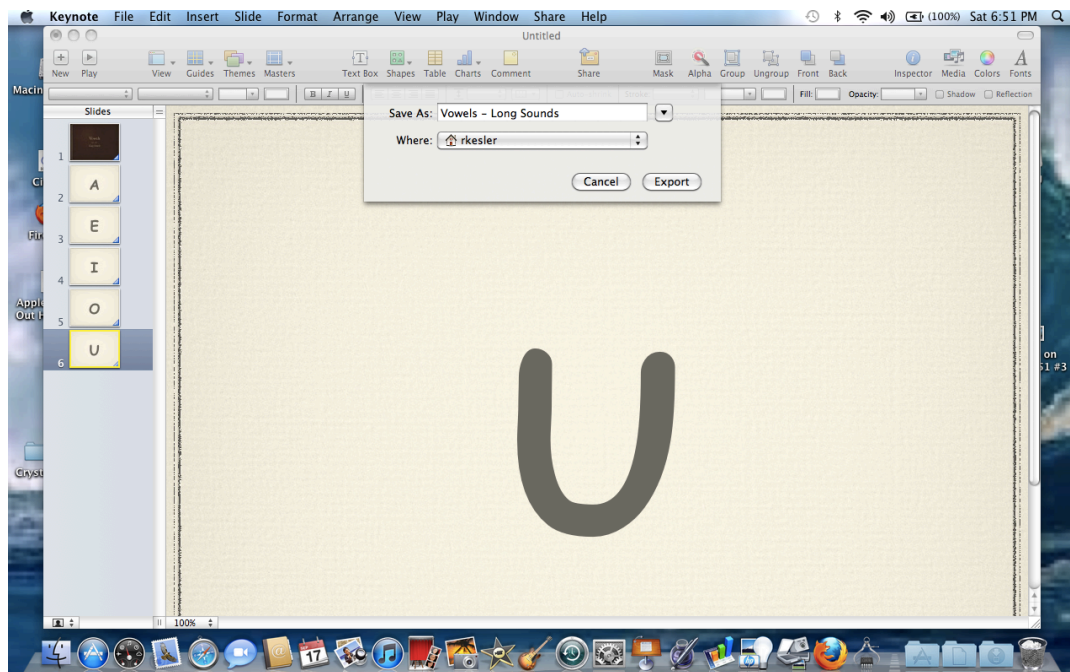
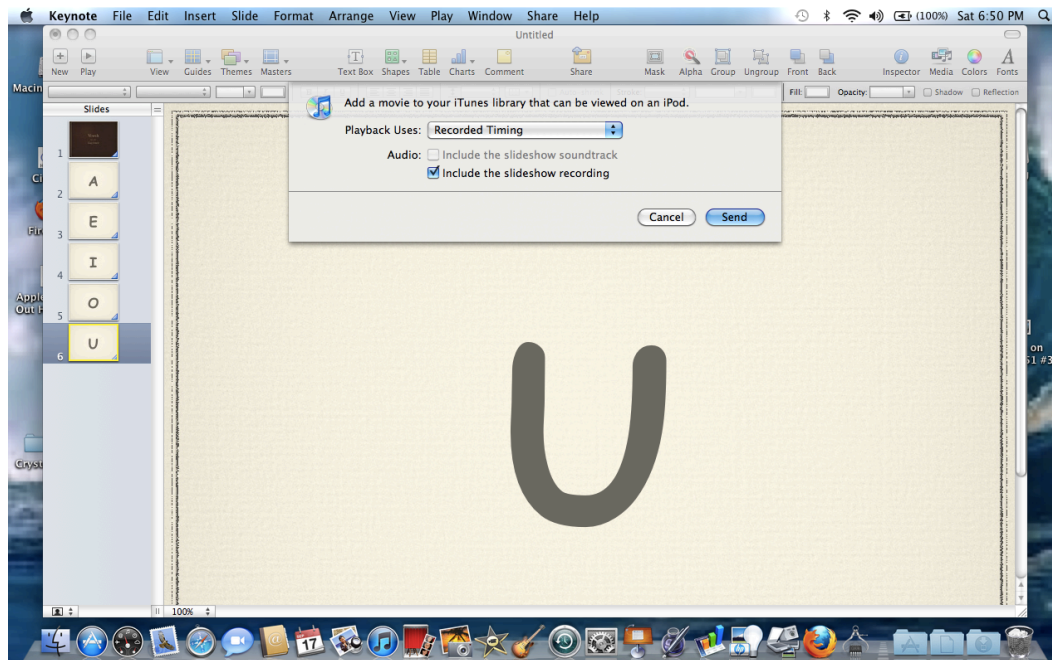
9. Type an "A" for the first vowel. Highlight and format the letter using the format tools: Comic Sans, Bold, 288.



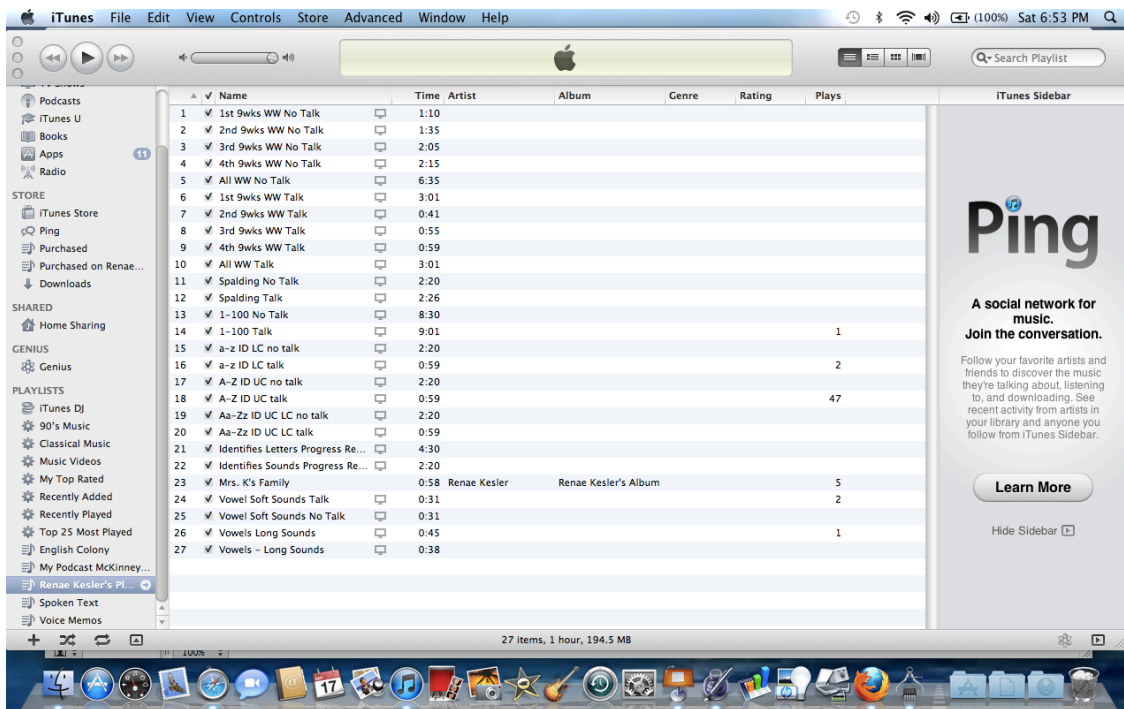
10. Click on the "A" slide. Press the keys "Command C" (to copy) and then, "Command V" (to paste) four times. This will copy the "A" slide 4 times. Go back and click on each slide and change the letter until you have one slide for A, E, I, O, and U. Your screen will look like the one below. Then, press the "Command Key" while clicking on each slide on the left of your screen. A yellow border will appear on each slide after it has been selected. Click on the "Inspector." Click on the second icon from the left which is the "Slide Inspector." Click on the drop down menu under "Effect" and pick "Sparkle." For "Duration", push the up arrow to "6.00 s" for six seconds. For "Start Transition" pick "Automatically" from the drop down menu. Click on the red circle at the top left of the "Inspector" window when finished with the above settings.



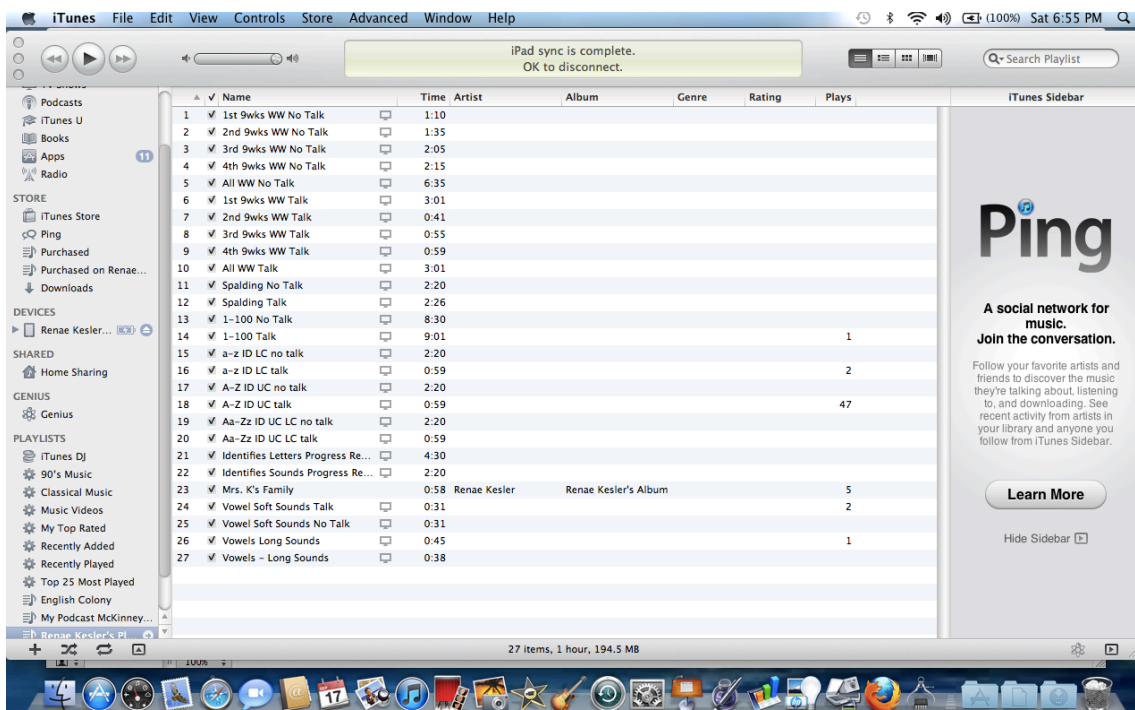
1. Click on the top slide in your slide show. Click "Play" on the top menu bar followed by "Record Slideshow." Anything you say after this point will be recorded. You will allow the sparkle effect to go across the first letter before saying the long sound of the vowel. This will allow the student to try to say it before they hear your voice with the answer for reinforcement. If you need to start over, click "Play" on the top menu bar followed by "Clear Recording." It will say "Are you sure you want to clear the recording." Press "Clear." You then click "Play" on the top menu bar followed by "Record Slideshow" again. Keep recording and clearing until you are happy with the results. Either click on the play button at the top left of the screen or click on "Play" on the top menu bar followed by "Play Slideshow" to make sure you are happy with your slideshow before sending it to iTunes.
2. Click on "Share" on the top menu bar followed by "Send To" followed by "iTunes..." "Playback uses" should have "Recorded Timing" selected and "include the slideshow recording" should have a check mark beside it. Then, click on the "Send" button. You will name your Keynote file "Vowels - Long Sounds", and select the directory where you would like it to be saved. Then, click the "Export" button. The screen will say "Export to Quicktime." You will wait until the export is finished.



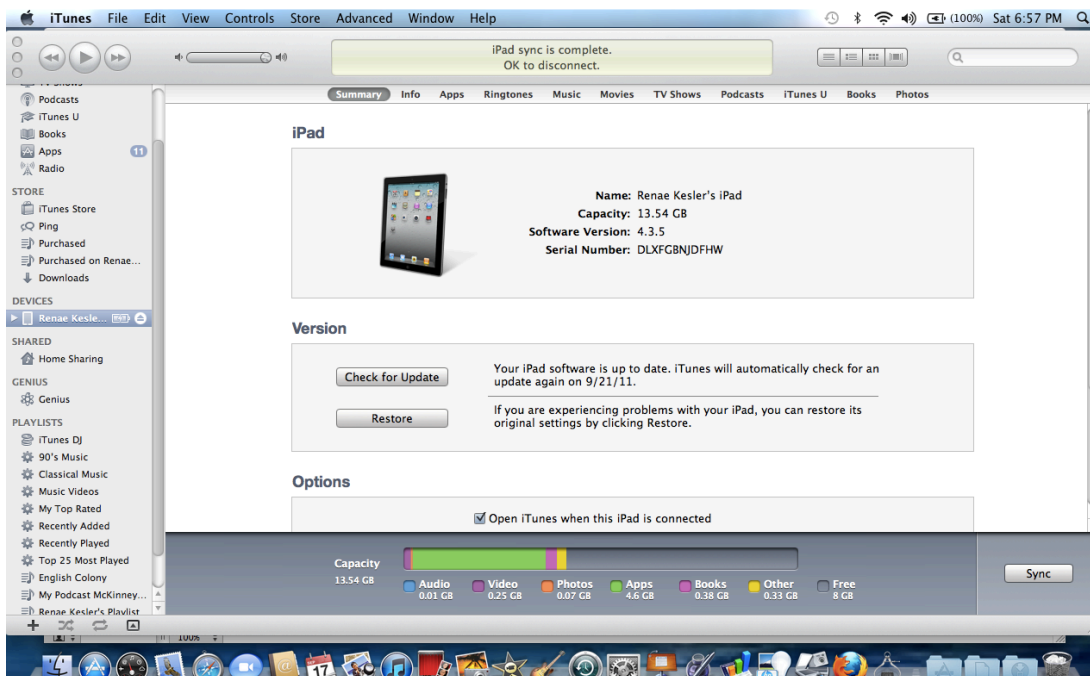
13. The iTunes window below will appear, and you will see the "Vowels - Long Sounds" file included as the last file.



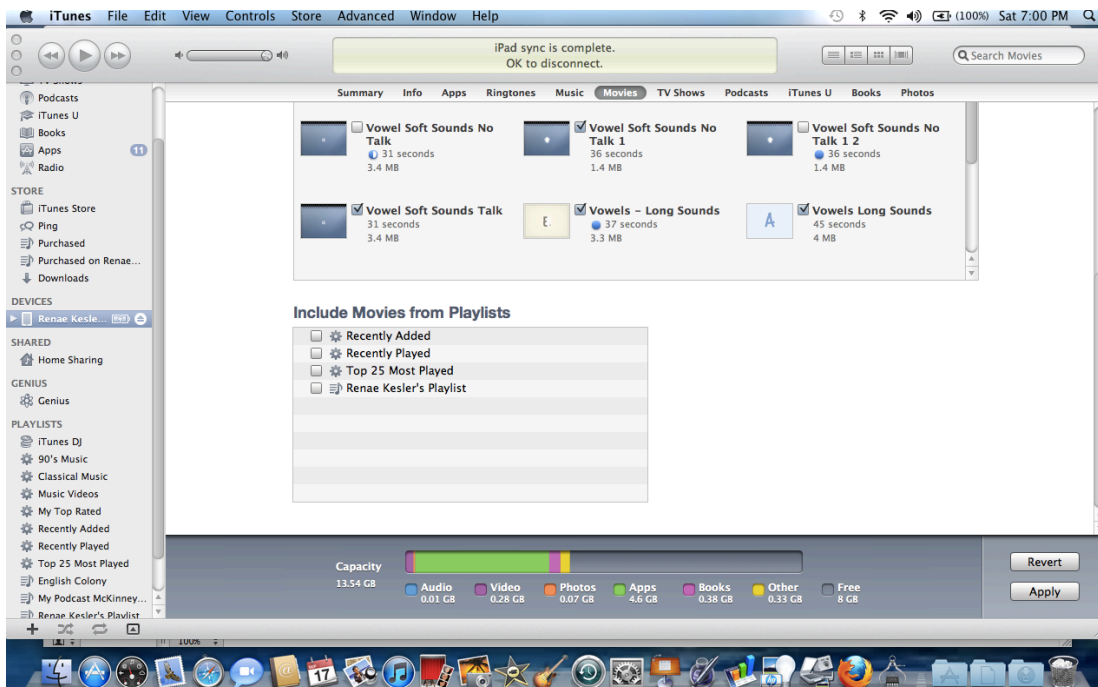
14. Plug in your IOS Device to your MacBook (if not already done). It will show up in iTunes under "Devices" as shown in the screen below.



15. Double-click on IOS Device under "Devices." Then, click on word "Movies" on iTunes menu bar.



16. Whichever movies you have a check mark by will be transferred to your IOS Device unless you click by "Automatically include all movies." Click on the "Apply" button. This will sync "Vowels - Long Sounds" to your IOS Device. You will see a message at the top during the syncing process. When it says "iPad sync is complete", you can disconnect your device.



17. Disconnect your IOS Device. Go to "Videos." Watch "Vowels - Long Sounds."
