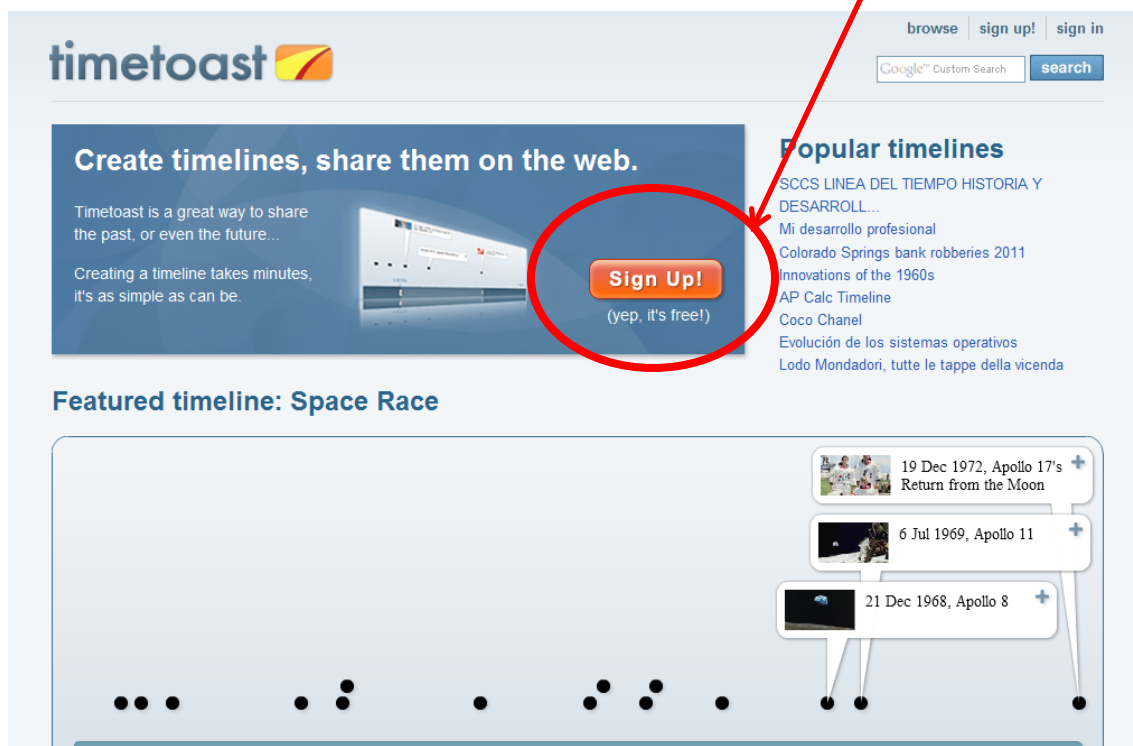
## Technology Instruction Page



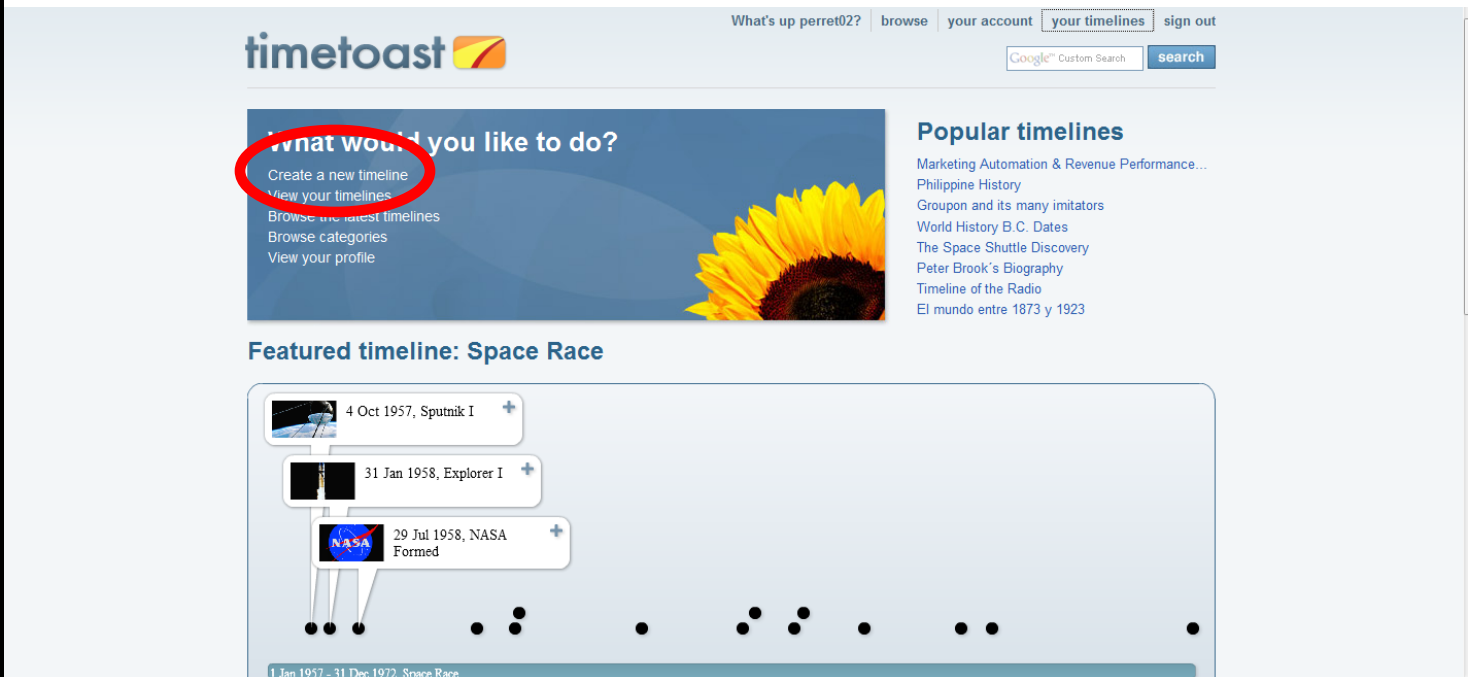
**Timetoast.com**

Timetoast allows you to create interactive timelines, which you can share anywhere on the web. Anyone can join Timetoast and start creating and sharing timelines. All you need is a valid email address. It's completely free!

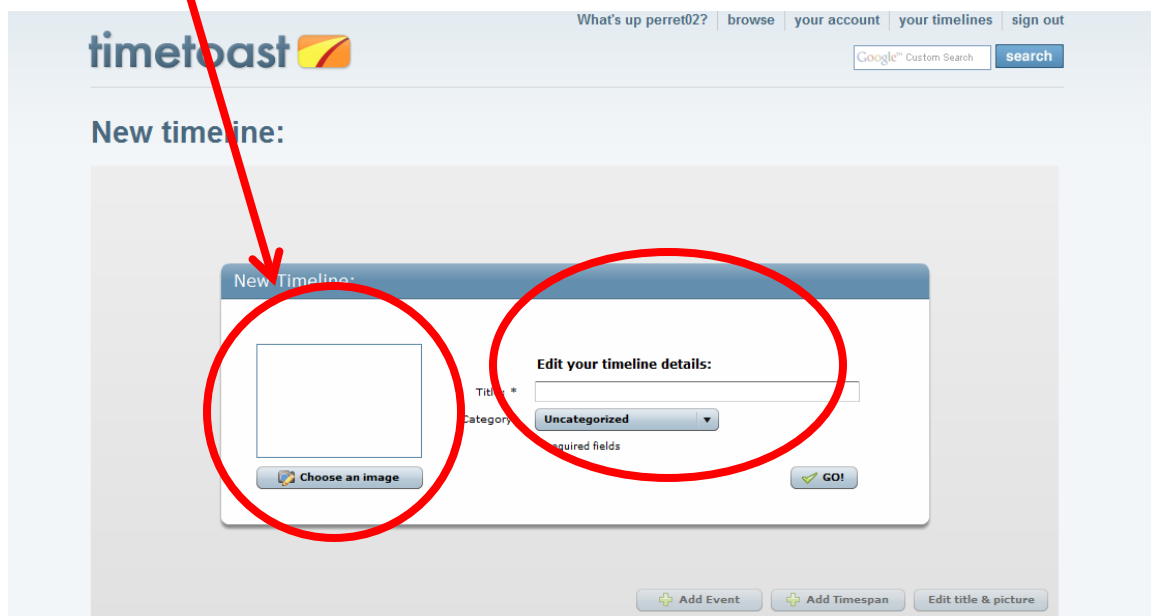
1. Go to [www.timetoast.com](http://www.timetoast.com) and sign up for a free account. Use your school district email and then a user friendly password so your students can login and create their own timelines.



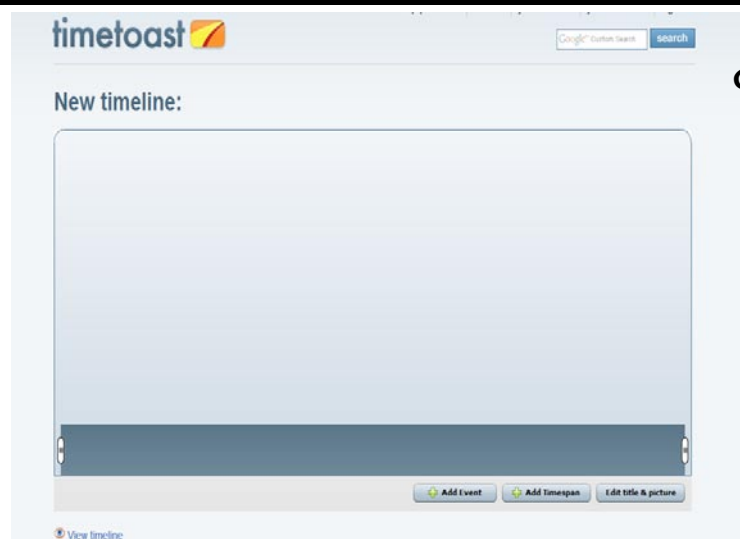
2. Once you have created your account, confirm your account through your email and log back in to your account.
3. At the top of the page under "What would you like to do?" click on "Create a new timeline."



4. Enter a title for your timeline and choose a category. You can also upload an image to go with your timeline. Click "Go" when finished.



5. When the page refreshes you are now ready to begin creating your timeline. Use the buttons at the bottom to add events or add a timespan. You can even go back and edit your title with the third button.





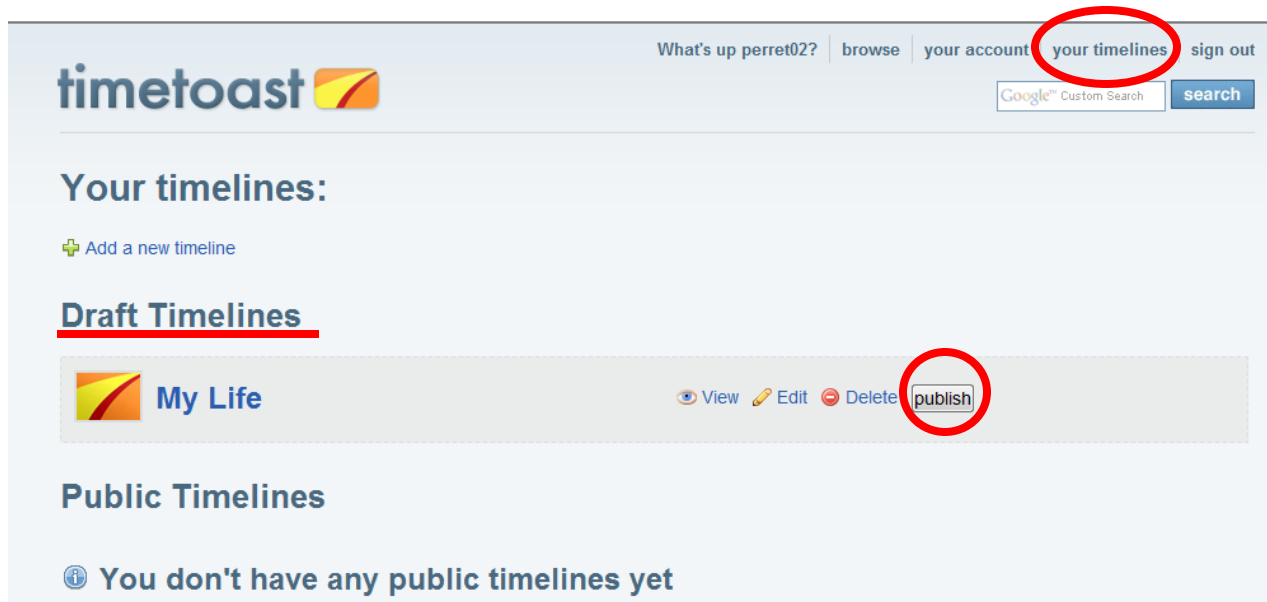
